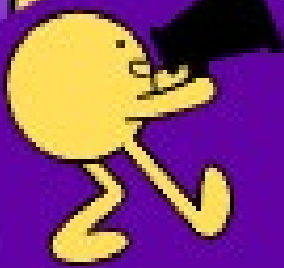
Children's Mental Health Week

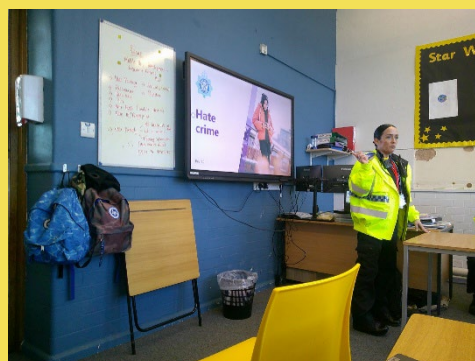
4.2.2025 – Dave Webb – Careers Discussion
