

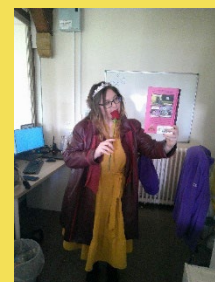
## Ash Wednesday Onsite Service

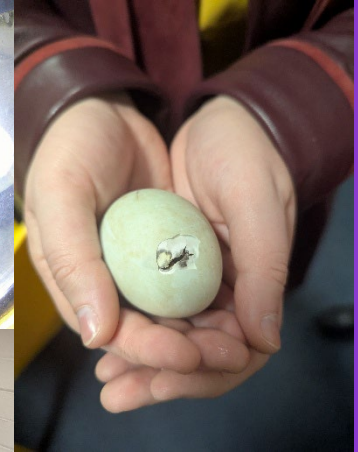
## Duckling Diaries
