PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENTS

- Student C was able to successfully participate in a college open day, with a limited level of staff support.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

- Student C achieved good academic outcomes that enabled him to successfully join a local college. The development of a range of personal skills while at Somerset School have given student C the confidence to participate in his college course with a high degree of independence. It has been reported that student C has notably taken a larger level of control over his own wellbeing both in and out of his new college placement.
- On completion of his studies at Somerset School, Student J was accepted into a college placement for further study. Student J had been with the school since Year 7 and staff had been able to take every step of his secondary educational journey with him. Student J successfully received the qualifications he required for his first-choice course and is currently working towards his desired career path.
- The personal development of student H within school was something that his family took great pride in. Student H left Somerset School as a young person with a clear picture of what he wanted to achieve in life, and more importantly a clear understanding of who he was and what measures worked for him. Student H successfully gained a wider series of qualifications that enabled him to join a local college to study his first-choice options.
